As part of his service on the Academic Council, (in the early and mid-1980's), Dr. Kreinin developed several **UNIVERSITY-WIDE FINANCIAL PLANS** at M.S.U. to help solve the University financial crisis. He guided the plans through the Governance system, up to the point of their implementation by the central administration. He consulted with 10-15 other universities, as well as national organizations, about these plans. As a result, variants and strands of the plans were adopted by several other universities. Dr. Kreinin was also invited to address associations of university presidents and of chief academic officers on matters affecting university finances and staffing. As Chairman of the University Committee on the Environment, Dr. Kreinin advised the central administration on priorities and budget reductions in the non-academic areas of the University.
